At The Coombes Church of England Primary School we take very seriously our responsibility to prepare children for life in modern Britain. We ensure that the fundamental British Values are introduced, discussed and lived out through the Christian ethos and work of the school. All curriculum areas provide a vehicle for furthering understanding of these concepts and, in particular, our RE, SMSC, PSHCE and Citizenship lessons provide excellent opportunities to deepen and develop understanding. Children embrace these concepts with enthusiasm and demonstrate a good understanding of their application to their own lives. The school makes considerable efforts to ensure children have exposure to a wide experience beyond their local community during which these concepts are shown, through for example, sporting events, a range of visit/visitors and use of outdoor education centres. The strong rooted Christian values-based understanding provided to children encourage them to embrace difference and be respectful and tolerant of others.

Within our school, pupils are encouraged to make choices, knowing that they are in a safe and supportive environment. They are encouraged to know, understand					
and exercise their rights and personal freedom and are advised how to exercise this safely eg through our PSHCE and E Safety sessions. Whether it be through the					
choice of challenge, how they record their work, their participation in extra-curricular activities and opportunities, pupils are given the freedom to make choices.					
Some examples of this in action are: use of learning logs to enable children the freedom to choose how best to respond / record a task, providing an element of					
choice in some key tasks to promote individuality and independence, use of flexible lesson structures to cater for different learning needs and styles and continuing					
to promote pupil independence with parents. The use of the UNICEF Rights and Responsibilities materials also helps to promote this.
