Word	Definition
Vehicle/Transport	A thing used for transporting people or goods, especially on land, such as a car, lorry, or cart
Travel	To make a journey, typically of some length
Engine	A machine with moving parts that converts power into motion
Animal	A living thing that has organs, a body and responds to environmental factors
Crop	A plant that is grown on a large scale to sell for food
Farm	An area of land and its buildings that is used for growing crops and rearing animals
Tractor	A powerful motor vehicle with large back wheels, used mainly on farms

Key Facts

Transport

- A vehicle is a mode of transport to help a person travel from one place to another
- Engines are used to power most vehicles today
- Some modes of transport are healthier for people than others
- Some vehicles can travel on roads but some can only travel in water or in the air

Farm

- A farm is a part of land that is used for raising animals or growing crops.
- There are different types of farms e.g. dairy and poultry farms
- UK farms often grow crops such as wheat, barley and vegetables
- UK farms often raise a range of animals such as cows, sheep, chicken, goats and pigs

The main crops that are grown in the UK are wheat, barley, oats, potatoes, sugar beets, fruit and vegetables.
