<b>Jungle</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Over half of the world's plants and animals live in a Jungle environment.</li><li>• Jungles are similar to Rainforests, but they have less trees and more sunlight.</li><li>• Jungles are in warm places with lots of rainfall.</li><li>• Jungles can usually be found near the equator which goes around the middle of the Earth.</li></ul>	
<b>Our World</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Recycling one can saves enough energy to power a TV for 3 hours.</li><li>• Each house in the UK produces waste that is the same weight as a small car.</li><li>• In the UK we throw away around 9.1 billion plastic bottles.</li><li>• Up to 60% of rubbish that ends up in the bin could be recycled.</li></ul>
